- SCT outpatient clinic and new patient evaluation (approximately 3 months)
- CART outpatient clinic
- · Apheresis and cell processing laboratory exposure

Other opportunities are available based on the interest.

Fellows have 6 months of research time and are expected to complete a scholarly research project during the fellowship.

Eligible applicants must:

• Have completed three (3) years of pediatric hematology/oncology fellowship training

- Be board certified or eligible in general pediatrics
- Be board certified or eligible in pediatric hematology/oncology/BMT in the United States or Canada upon matriculation
- Be able to obtain a Massachusetts medical license
